# Our Common Journey

## The Death of a Loved One

At some point, every family has to face the reality that life ends. Sometimes it is as the result of an illness, or after a long life, but sometimes it happens suddenly, with no time to prepare.

## Hearing the News

When a death occurs, the immediate family has the task of letting other family members and friends know what has happened. This is often when the fact that a loved one has died begins to sink in.

## Family Gathers

Often the family home becomes a busy place, as family members gather to make pressing decisions about what should be done next. Usually around this time the family meets with

one of our funeral directors, either at the funeral home, or at the family's home, to plan out the details of the funeral.

## Friends Support

As the word spreads, friends surround the family and offer support. People want to offer support by sending flowers or a card, calling, or dropping off a meal.

## Public Mourning

This is an opportunity for you to invite your community to join you in your grief, to offer support and to remember the deceased. Visitation hours provide a structured time for people to offer condolences to the family. A funeral or memorial service allows for a time to reflect, and to say goodbye. The tone of this service is often impacted by religious beliefs and worldviews held by the deceased and the family.

## Final Goodbye

At this point, we say goodbye to the body of our loved one, and begin to realize that life must go on without his or her physical presence.

## Private Grieving

Grief does not end with the funeral. The grief a family experiences is very real and will last a long time. Often this is done in private, with close family and friends offering support. Many times we will begin to seek support from those who understand.

## Adjusting to Change

Life must continue without the person who has died. Slowly a family adjusts to the absence of the deceased. Life changes but it does go on.

# Arrangement Options:

To make it convenient, we've created four arrangement options. Any option can be tailored to fit the needs of your family.



## A) FULL SERVICES

Visitation and Service on Separate Days.....\$6,140

“Grief shared is grief diminished.” Holding a visitation and service allows for you to invite your community to support you in a difficult time. This option allows you plenty of time for friends and family to gather. The visitation and service may be held at our facility, or at a facility of your choice. Reception staff and facilities are available at an additional cost.

## B) FULL SERVICES

Visitation and/or Service on the Same Day.....\$4,850

Sometimes it may make more sense to hold a visitation and service on the same day. Or you may wish not to have a visitation and simply hold a service at our Chapel, or another facility. On the other hand, a visitation, with no formal service, may suit your family's needs better. This option includes all the same services as Option A, with everything happening on one day.

C) PRIVATE FAMILY GOODBYE.....\$2,820

It is always helpful to allow time for your family to say goodbye. This includes a small gathering at the funeral home prior to travelling together to the cemetery or crematory.

D) SIMPLY CREMATION.....\$2,030

For those wishing no private or public ceremony this option includes basic professional services and documents, transportation from the place of death, temporary facility for shelter, and the transfer to the cemetery or crematorium.

# Itemized Services:

## Basic Professional Fees..... \$995

Professional consultation with licensed personnel, which may include but is not limited to: expert advice on options to meet your needs, including essential services relating to disposition, drafting notices, planning scheduling of services and advising regarding possible government benefits. A basic professional fee is payable whenever we provide services to you.

## Coordinating Rites and Ceremonies..... \$195

Co-ordination of all rites and ceremonies before, during and after they have been provided, including services and supplies provided by us, as well as those provided by third party suppliers, such as flowers and death notices.

## Documentation..... \$295

Completion and filing of all documents necessary to carry out the services and supplies requested, including, but not limited to: death registration, burial permit, coroner's certificate for cremation and documentation necessary to ship the body out of the country. As part of this service, we will provide you with proof of death certificates; such certificates are usually accepted for most estate settlement purposes, but sometimes a provincial

Death Certificate will be necessary and is available from the Office of the Registrar General.

## Transport Remains – Basic..... \$295

Transportation of the remains from one place to another, for example the hospital to our premises, or from our premises to the cemetery or crematorium using a transfer vehicle, for distances not exceeding 50 km.

## Basic Preparation..... \$195

The preparation of the body for placement into the casket, including bathing, dressing and the setting of facial features for identification or viewing without embalming.

## Embalming..... \$270

Embalming is the process of replacing blood and bodily fluids with chemical preservatives. It is a process of sanitation, restoration and temporary preservation. Embalming is not legally required, but may be recommended to preserve the body between the time of death and the visitation or disposition of the deceased. Our professional funeral directors will make a recommendation based on the condition of the body and expected service needs.

## Staff Services – Visitation..... \$570/\$895

(On-site/Off-site) Staff to coordinate and oversee the Visitation (informal gathering) at our premises. If the visitation takes place at an off-site location, an equipment charge and additional staff services charges will apply in lieu of facility fees.

## Staff Services – Ceremony..... \$570/\$995

(On-site/Off-site) Staff to coordinate and oversee the Ceremony or Memorial at our premises. If the Ceremony or Memorial takes place at an off-site location, an equipment charge and additional staff services charges will apply in lieu of and equivalent to facility use fees.

## Staff Services – Reception..... \$190

Staff services in preparation for, during, and after the Reception time.

## Funeral Celebrant..... \$275

Staff service provided to plan, lead, host and coordinate the details of the Service or Ceremony.

## Facilities – Preparation/ Embalm/Shelter..... \$150/\$195

Facilities used to prepare, embalm and/or shelter the deceased; this charge applies whenever the deceased is in our facility for any purpose.

**Facilities – Visitation.....\$725**

A room or rooms for the reception of family or friends during the Visitation period, which includes use of a coffee lounge.

**Facilities – Ceremony.....\$725**

Use of our chapel and equipment for one hour prior to the Funeral Service in addition to the service time.

**Facilities – Reception.....\$290**

Use of reception facilities following the Funeral Service or Ceremony including hot and cold refreshments, dishes and napkins.

**Memorial Stationery .....\$290**

Personalized guest register book, cards, thank you notes, laminated obituary bookmarks and service folders including all design and printing.

**Vehicles –**

**Lead/Clergy/Interment.....\$165**

A vehicle used to drive the clergy where necessary and/or to escort the funeral procession to the place of final disposition and/or to meet the family for a graveside service.

**Vehicles – Limousine .....\$255**

A limousine to accommodate family or pallbearers on the day of the Service or Ceremony.

**Vehicles – Subsequent transfer of remains .....\$330/\$595**

A vehicle for transfer of the deceased to the place of Service or Ceremony and/or the cemetery or crematory.

**Vehicles – Utility Van .....\$75**

A general purpose vehicle to transfer equipment or flowers to the place of the Service or Ceremony and/or to the cemetery or other local delivery location.

**Equipment for Off-site services .....\$300/\$430**

The provision of funeral equipment for Visitation and/or Ceremony provided off-site.

**Pacemaker Removal .....\$35**

The removal and disposal of a pacemaker when required prior to cremation.

**Chapel Musician .....\$135**

Services of a musician provided by the funeral home for accompaniment during a service.

# Are you thinking of Burial?

We would be honoured to assist you in arranging for burial, and in selecting cemetery property.

## Some facts about burial:

The body is buried in a casket, and the casket may be placed in a concrete liner or a vault. The body can be buried shortly after death, after a visitation and/or funeral service, or before a memorial service. The body may be buried in the ground, or entombed in a mausoleum. Embalming is not required for burial, but may be recommended, depending on the visitation and funeral arrangements.

## Do I need to purchase a vault?

Some cemeteries either require or recommend purchasing a vault or cemetery liner to enclose the casket in the ground. This offers protection from the weight of the earth, and in the case of sealing vaults, protection from the elements in the ground.

## Planning Ahead

We believe it is a good idea to select burial plots ahead of the time of need if possible. Selecting a final resting place for a loved one is an important

We have jewelry options that can incorporate your loved one’s fingerprint or locket that will hold an important photo. Ask one of us to tell you about the many options available.


### **What mementos or personal items can be placed in a casket prior to burial?**

Any personal items can be placed in the casket, like notes or photos, which can be a helpful way to say goodbye. We will ask you whether any jewelry or mementos placed with your loved one during the visitation should be left with the person, or returned to the family. If desired, we can donate eyeglasses to charity.

### **Are keepsakes for cremation only?**

Some people find it helpful to have a part of their loved one to keep with them, as a special

## **The Cremation Process**

Cremation involves reducing the body to bone fragments by applying intense heat (approximately 1000 degrees Celsius) for a period of two to three hours. The cremated remains, which are commonly referred to as ashes, are removed from the cremation chamber, and any metal objects are removed. The cremated remains are then processed, so that they are of an equal consistency. They will often appear white or grey in colour, and typically weigh between 1 to 2 kilograms.

## **What mementos or personal items can be placed in a casket prior to cremation?**

Any personal items can be placed in the casket, like notes or photos, which can be a helpful way to say goodbye. Since most items will be destroyed as part of the cremation process, we suggest that jewellery be removed and placed inside the urn with the cremated remains after the cremation has taken place.

### **What funeral services can be selected if cremation is chosen?**

Cremation does not limit the funeral services that may be chosen. The same options available with earth burial are available with cremation. Some of these choices include the type of casket, having an open casket viewing or visitation, location of service, and type of funeral or memorial service. Ask one of us if you have any questions about this.

### **Our Crematorium**

We will arrange cremation with any crematorium, but we suggest Evergreen Crematorium, located on the grounds of the Milton Evergreen Cemetery. We, along with many other family-owned funeral homes, are part owners of the crematorium, and we feel that Evergreen can best serve the needs of your family. The crematorium is located in a beautiful building, which has a chapel that can seat up to 50 people for a ceremony.

### **Attending the Cremation**

We are used to being present for the burial of a loved one, but have you considered attending the cremation? Some families find it beneficial to accompany us to the crematorium, and to have a goodbye ceremony in the Evergreen Crematorium Chapel, as a way of seeing the process through. If desired, you may even witness the beginning of the cremation process in a respectful manner. The drive from Waterdown to Milton is a beautiful one that takes us through the countryside north of Burlington. Many families have appreciated accompanying their loved one for a final journey. Ask your funeral director about how this might work for your family.

# Celebrant Services

## What is a Funeral Celebrant?

A Celebrant is a person who is trained and certified to meet the needs of families during their time of loss. A Celebrant serves by providing a funeral service that is personalized to reflect the personality and life-style of the deceased.

## Why Use a Certified Celebrant?

The training for Celebrants established by the In-Sight Institute seeks to provide the most comprehensive and sensitive training available. It is important that you and your family know that you are being served by someone who understands the process and is prepared to offer the very best service possible.

## What Does a Certified Celebrant Offer the Family?

A Celebrant has been specifically trained to design a service for your loved one that is completely personal, incorporating those unique stories, songs and experiences that defined the loved one. A Celebrant will schedule a special Family Time for your family to share memories,

anecdotes and special moments in the loved one's life. The essence of the service will be based upon the remembrances of the family. The Celebrant will consult with you to help design a service that best reflects and memorializes the life of your loved one. The Celebrant can serve at a funeral service, memorial service, graveside service, anniversary tribute, tree planting, bench dedication or any other gathering designed to honour the deceased.

## What is the Cost?

The Celebrant will spend approximately 10 hours in preparation for your service as well as the expense of maintaining a resource library and on-going training. The average cost for the Funeral Celebrant Services is \$275.00 plus H.S.T. and may be added to your funeral service account.

# Casket Selection

The two main purposes of a casket are to provide the primary protection of the deceased in burial, and to act as a focal point during the services. Therefore, choosing the right casket for yourself or a loved one is a very personal decision.

The value, selection and cost of caskets are affected by a number of factors such as materials of construction, design details and personalization features. Basically there are two types of caskets – metal and wood.



## WOOD

Wood caskets can either be of solid construction, or made of select wood veneers. Most people who choose a wood casket do so because of the warmth and beauty of the wood. In fact, no two wood caskets are identical, since the graining patterns are unique to each one.



# Burial Vaults

Some cemeteries require you to purchase a burial vault or concrete liner, but other cemeteries give you the option. The diagram to the right demonstrates the benefits of a liner or burial vault. A concrete liner or a sealing burial vault will provide stability for the ground, as well as protection for the casket. Burial vaults will also seal the casket from the elements.

Cremation containers differ from caskets in their function as they are not intended for the long term care of the deceased, but serve their function during the funeral ceremony only. As a result there are a number of modest cremation containers available to be used when the services are of a private or brief nature and serve mostly to transport and carry the deceased for cremation.

When visiting hours and a funeral service are part of the arrangement, many families appreciate the option of a rental casket. These caskets are identical in appearance to the burial caskets, yet they function differently. Only the interior shell and bedding of the rental casket is purchased and accompanies the deceased throughout the funeral right to cremation.

The exterior shell of the casket serves as ornamentation and is only rented for the period of the funeral. This introduces some practical cost savings and reduces wood combustion in the cremation process.

# Urn Vaults

Urn vaults are used to contain the urn for burial. This provides protection for the urn and helps to prevent the urn from shifting with ground frost and helps identify the parameters of the burial space in the lot.

Many people also use this as a receptacle for placing personal items of meaning with the remains. These vaults are available in fiberglass or cultured marble from \$345 to \$450.



# NICHE

A niche is a space within a granite columbarium where an urn can be placed alone or in a companion space in perpetuity within a cemetery. Some indoor niches have a glass front where the urn can be displayed along with small memorabilia. Most niches have a stone front with either engraved or bronze plate memorialization. It is important to know the dimensions of the niche when selecting an urn for this purpose.



# SCATTERING

Scattering the cremated remains of a loved one is a big decision as it cannot be reversed. Cremated remains are not light weight like wood ash, but are weighty and granular, more like fine gravel. This should be taken into account when scattering as they should not be left on the surface but turned under the ground. Your own private property may be used for scattering, but other's property is off limits. Common land can be used for this purpose with discretion. This is a decision that should be discussed with all concerned, and the option of scattering a portion and allowing for the interment of the balance of the cremated remains in a cemetery where your loved one can be memorialized is worth consideration.

*Most urns are also available in a smaller keepsake size as a way of keeping a portion of remains if burial or scattering is chosen.*

# Engraving, Monuments & Markers

- Would you like any personal photos, or any designs to be included?

**The design process works like this:**

We meet with you to design and sketch out your memorial. A line-drawing or proof is made up, and sent to you by e-mail or regular mail. Any changes may still be made until you are 100% happy with the design. At that point, the order is placed. A typical timeframe is 8-12 weeks from the time of order to installation in the cemetery, at which time we will inform you that it has been completed.







# Caring For You *Coping with Loss*



## Many people who experience loss have confusing emotions such as:

- Feeling like they are going crazy
- Feeling all alone as others carry on with their lives

- Feelings of guilt or anger


